Letter of Introduction—Please include a one page letter of introduction so that we know who you, or your team are. This is an opportunity for you to let us know where you come from and get to know you better through story.

Abstract—Abstracts should be no longer than one page (Times New Roman, font size 11, single-spaced) and may include references (no longer than an additional page). Please provide an outline of your intended research and how it relates to climate policy.

Ethics Approval—If the research involves human subjects and/or fieldwork, applicants should submit verification of ethics approval from the community/region (if applicable) and their Institution’s Research Ethics Board. Research must demonstrate that it follows [Tri-Council Policy Statement Chapter 9](#). If you are conducting scientific research that requires ethics approval, documentation must also be provided. Applicants must also commit to having permissions and the case study completed before the final submission at the end of March.

CV/Resume—Please include the most recent copy of your CV and merge it with this application form.

Submission Information—All submission materials should be compiled in a single pdf document in the format (Last NameFirst name_Area of Interest_Date.pdf). This ensures that no materials will be missing for the adjudication review committee. Programs such as [this](#) are free and can be used if you do not have Adobe.
